Bowel Cancer Awareness During 2013 we are helping to promote awareness around bowel cancer as it is the second most common cause of cancer deaths in the UK but as adults it's a subject we don't like talking about. If treated early there is a very good chance of recovery. Here are some of the symptoms to look out for: -

- Bleeding from your bottom/or blood in your poo
- A pain or lump in your tummy
- A change in bowel habit lasting 3 weeks or more—especially loose or runny poo
- Extreme tiredness for no obvious reason
- Unexplained weight loss

# Guide to the NHS—Clinical Commissioning Groups or CCG's

We are aware that the NHS is under going radical changes. These changes are having an impact on GP practices. Here is q quick guide to Clinical Commissioning Groups or CCG's. Our practice belongs to LNCCG (Leeds North CCG) which consists of 33 practices in this locality. There are a further two CCG's in Leeds—Leeds West and Leeds South and East. We are all working together buying and designing local care services which include emergency and urgent care, mental health, learning disability, community health including health visitors, district nurses, maternity services—to name a few. Each CCG is given a budget based on their population to buy the most appropriate health care for the people they look after. The Government hopes that through this change local GP's and clinicians will have more direct influence over the healthcare services in terms of quality and so allow more effective use of NHS resources.

How will this affect you? Hopefully, as your GP, we will have more influence over health care services available to you. You are able to go to the CCG's public meeting to give your views and concerns and to talk to the people who have made decisions regarding healthcare in our community.
